FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I hope your Advent is going well. Participation in parish giving events like the gift collection, the food drive and parish support allow us all to reach out to our neighbors in need as well as the Holy Infant of Bethlehem. If you were able to join us for the Carol Sing and blessing of the creche and Christmas Tree or the quiet Holy Hour on Monday, hopefully you had the chance to relax a bit and enjoy the true meaning of the Advent Season--time to enrich your life as a member of the family which is our Church.

We enter the darkest days of winter this week but then soon the winter solstice (Dec. 21) leads us back to the light. This is the reason for the placement of the Nativity of Christ in December as the Emperor Constantine was making the effort to replace the former Roman festivals of the sun god as well as establishing the date of the Incarnation, March 25th. This was the original "Christmas Countdown"-nine months of pregnancy until Christmas!

The significance of Christ's Light conquering the darkness was not lost on the members of the Church, especially in the northern regions of Europe. The liturgical development of the Advent and Christmas Seasons began to take shape in the latter part of the fifth and sixth centuries. Very much scripturally based, the season began with the evening prayers of the nativity and ended with the Feast of the Presentation in February. It DID NOT begin with Halloween or Labor Day and end around noon on the 25th.

Christmas is God becoming flesh in order to bring us a share in the Divine life. It should be more than a day centered on shopping and then planning to return the gifts the next day. Christmas should touch our hearts—humbling us and exalting us at the same time. Use the season of Advent to prepare for a meaningful encounter with the Word of God made flesh, this Christmas.
