FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Beloved, we are God's children now..." This beautiful line from our second reading this weekend reminds us of God's commitment to us as the Loving Father. Through our baptism we are made heirs to the Kingdom and brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus. Think about that. No matter how young or old; we are God's children. St. John goes on to say that what will come will be even better.

This is a glimpse into what heaven will be. Higher than the angels, we shall be like God and praise God forever. We often think we will become angels when we die. Reinforced by children's books and artwork as well as cartoons—I grew up with Sylvester the cat or Wile E. Coyote turning into angels with wings, harps, and halos after their plans to destroy Tweety Bird or the Road Runner failed drastically. Who could survive that fall off the cliff while carrying a lit bundle of ACME Dynamite and then having that anvil fall on your head?

On a more grown-up note, even the prayers at the cemetery seem to suggest we get our wings in heaven when we pray to God that our dearly departed "may join your angels in heaven." Again, an issue with translation into English, the text means to infer that we join them in praising God for ever in heaven-- alongside the angels.

For me, the worry isn't so much about what heaven will be like so much as, am I going to ever find out! Luckily for me, for all of us, God goes above and beyond to get us there. He sent the Prophets and Moses, and finally His only Son, as our Good Shepherd. Christ guides our earthly journey and leads us home to heaven. We stray at times, we don't move along all the time but always, our Good Shepherd is calling to us, tending to our needs and feeding us with His Sacred Body and Blood.

Beloved we are God's children now. We are Christ's flock now. And if we just cooperate it is going to be even better.
