FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Moving through the summer months we looked at the various parts of the Mass and last week reflected on "the Mass has ended, go in peace!" The Mass is a perpetual sacrifice and does not really end. Neither does our participation. If the Eucharist is indeed the "source and summit of our lives," about an hour each weekend is just the beginning. Jesus is present to you in the Eucharist and desires to remain with you during the week and for eternity. We live (or should live) as Eucharistic people all day, every day, all throughout our lives.

Pause in prayer throughout the day to reflect on the past weekend's readings and prayers of the Mass. Offer some private prayer time during your commute on your lunch break. Pray together with the other members of your household. The form prayers of our Mass or devotions are a good place to start but also time for prayers from the heart, shared with God and your family members.

Find opportunities to offer God your gratitude through works of charity. Move deeper you're your practice of the faith. Share your Catholic perspective in your relationships at work, in the community and especially in your home. Celebrate the Eucharist well but most importantly, live the Eucharist well.
