

It's Advent! The time of peaceful waiting for the Messiah. Find some peace for yourself in the coming weeks. A few moments of prayer and meditation to focus on Christ coming to you this Christmas. Light up your Advent wreath at home and watch the gentle light increase each week (a blessing is included in this bulletin). Pray for each person as you write out their Christmas card or wrap the gift. Maybe you can't get them to pray with you but pray that they pray.

Join us on Monday afternoons if your schedule permits, to pray in silence before the Blessed Sacrament anytime between 3-4 PM. Feel free to stop by and spend some quiet time in church during the week. It is usually open between 5:30 AM and 6:00 PM.

Help yourself to some of the Advent devotional materials in the vestibule. The "little blue books" from Saginaw Diocese are simple and yet provocative, helping you to have a more prayerful Advent journey. A selection of booklets from Word on Fire publishing is available as well. This series of meditations and reflections for each Advent Day invites you to pray and keep a small journal for spiritual growth.

Before lighting the first candle, make the sign of the cross and pray-

Lord, our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: He is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, He is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, He is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May He come quickly and not delay.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
