White candles on the Advent wreath???

Yup. There is no set color requirements for the candles. If I wanted to be more extreme, they would be the golden yellow of pure beeswax candles, but I didn't feel like spending close to \$1000.00 on them. Many are familiar with the traditional three purples and a pink, which coincide with the priest's vestments for the season, while others also use four reds or three blues and a pink.

The white candles in the wreath are marked with purple and pink decoration and offset with the matching bows.

What about the rest of it? It is a wreath, a circle without beginning or end, like the Kingdom of God. The evergreen boughs represent eternal life. The tradition was most popular in the northern territories of Europe where the long winter nights were soon to be vanquished by the winter solstice and the coming of more daylight and the Light of Christ.

The placement of the wreath is all wrong! The Advent wreath should be suspended from the ceiling over the congregation. (maybe next year). The congregants would look up through the wreath to catch a glimpse of the heavens.

Have a blessed Advent (regardless of the color of your candles)!

When the tree is decorated, the family gathers around it and makes the sign of the cross. One member of the family recites the following: This tree is a blessing to our home. It reminds us of all that is beautiful, all the is filled with the gentleness and the promise of God.

It stands in our midst as a tree of light that we might promise such beauty to one another and to our world. It stands like that tree of paradise that God made into the tree of life, the cross of Jesus Christ.

May your blessing be upon all who gather around this tree, all who keep the Christmas festival by its lights. We wait for the coming of Christ, the days of everlasting light, justice, and peace. Feast of the Immaculate Conception is moved to Monday because it falls on a Sunday. The obligation, USUALLY is not transferred due to a decision about 30 years ago by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. This is why holy days are sometimes obligatory and other times not. However, for some reason, the Bishop's Conference decided that it would not be the case this year, as this the title of our Blessed Mother as patron of the United States. However, all the liturgical calendars, directories (ordos), and mass books were already published, printed and in the pews. Archbishop Coyne has written extensively about it in this month's Catholic Transcript about it. In a nutshell, it is both a holy day and day of obligation BUT he has granted dispensation to anyone who cannot attend Mass on Monday. NOTE if you are from Massachusetts, it might not apply to you. There is Mass here on Monday at 8:00 AM.
