

Following the stars to encounter Christ. This wasn't just a "Magi Thing"! If you stop and think back to the four Sundays of Advent, most of us had a name or two which we added to the gold/silver stars for our "Come Home for Christmas" program again this year. We prayed and some came home. Some have even stayed. I actually had two young people come up and ask how they could become Catholic! The stars work! Maybe it was your adult grandchildren coming to Christmas Mass. Maybe it was a family member deciding it was "just time" to come back. The stars are working! They are working because of the prayers. Maybe this wasn't your experience yet but just trust and keep praying.

The Magi were drawn by the star to find its meaning. The star brought them to the Promised Messiah, not in the royal palace but in the manger, wrapped in swaddling clothes. The star led them to a wonderment that led to a life altering event. A prayer for the ages that is still repeated some 2020 plus years later.
