# From the Pastor's Desk

Canon Law and civil law require that every Roman Catholic Parish Corporation have two lay trustees. The role of the lay trustee is to both support and challenge the pastor in the operation of the parish in matters of property and finance. They are the "ex-officio" members of the parish finance and pastoral councils and from time-to-time witness or sign legal documents for both the Church and state. Trustees are supposed to serve a one-year term, renewable for up to four years. However, it sometimes is extended well beyond that for a variety of reasons.

Here at Sacred Heart Roman Catholic Parish Corporation, like most parishes, the good and faithful trustees have not only served longer than the four-year maximum, they served above and beyond the call of duty. Upon my arrival, I asked the parish trustees, Margie Osowiecki, and Janet-Helmke-Elmore to remain on in the transition year and through the finalization of the sale of the St. Joseph property last year. All the time receiving pressure from the chancery to bring on new trustees.

With all that behind us and taking a chance to at least *try to* keep the new archbishop happy, I thank them both from the bottom of my heart for their dedication and support of our parish family and my ministry. As of midnight on January 31, their long terms will come to a close. After prayerful consideration, our new parish trustees, for a term of one year, renewable for four terms, will be Gail Szoka and Mark Sullivan. Please pray for them as they begin this new chapter of our parish, Church, and world history.
