Rosary Tuesday Morning at 7:35 AM



Every year, the archbishop blesses the Oil of the Catechumen, used for baptisms, the Oil of the Infirm, used for Anointing of the Sick and consecrates the Sacred Chrism which is used for baptisms, Confirmation, Holy Orders and the consecration of altars. The Mass also includes a renewal of priestly vows and recognition of the jubilarians in our presbyterate. It is a beautiful liturgy, and you are invited to attend.
